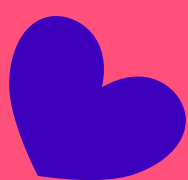
they can make a positive impact in their communities.

# EMPTY YOURSELF

The best part of my business is having my assets used by random people and getting paid for it. Business has its ups and downs, but I've learned to navigate through it all. Over time, I've understood one truth: every person I deal with teaches me something, whether they mean to or not.

Bad customers frustrate me the most. They use my services, break their word, and leave without paying. But even they've taught me something. People like that often share traits which are being prideful, entitled, ungrateful. Over time, I've learned to spot them early and take precautions before any transaction begins.

But then there are the others, the rare few who restore your faith in people. The ones who never risk their reputation. Sometimes I feel like they're the ones serving me. The way they handle loss, how they carry themselves, being calm when things go wrong... I watch them closely. They have something I admire.

I'd offer such customers credit without hesitation, because I know, one day or another, they'll settle every account.

I always keep things ready for my regulars. That day, I was expecting one of my favorite customers to stop by. He visits once a month. But before he arrived, a group of strangers stormed into my office. They looked uneasy, like they were hiding something, and their energy was off. I hadn't seen them before, but right away, I sensed they

weren't the kind of guests I'd want.

They didn't greet me. They just barged in and said, rudely, "We want food. We'll be staying here a while. We have money, so get on with it." Their tone was sharp and condescending.

Something was off. My staff looked uneasy. I told them to stay alert. As we prepared the food, I overheard one of them mutter to another, laughing, "Easy target... wish we got fools like this every day."

My heart pounded. I just wanted them out. Whatever they were planning, may God Himself send them away.

Then something strange happened.

Just as quickly as they had arrived, they left. No argument. No meal finished. They looked unsettled, whispering sharply, throwing glances behind them as they walked out. It was like they'd seen something or someone that made them change their minds.

I breathed a sigh of relief. But just as I was catching my breath, someone knocked at the door. Urgently. I opened it to find my favorite customer, panting and out of breath with a man slung over his shoulder unconscious, bloodied, half-breathing.

We rushed to help him. Following the customer's instructions, we laid the injured man in one of our finest rooms. I asked, "what happened? And who is this man?"



He looked at me and said with pain in his voice. "I found him on the roadside. Left for dead. Beaten badly. I.. I..(His voice was breaking) I couldn't leave him like that."

But what struck me most was what left me speechless, which is that the unconscious man was a Jew. And the one who carried him in... was a Samaritan who is despised by Jews!

They're enemies. Always have been. And yet, here he was tending to him like a brother.

I hesitated. But I had to ask. "Why?"

He paused, as if the question didn't need an answer. Then he looked at me and said, almost smiling

"Because sometimes the right thing," he said,

"is emptying yourself."

That was all. I didn't understand his words.

He didn't even stay the night, as he usually did. When I asked why, he said he didn't have money to trade this month. Because he'd spent what he had to cover for Jew's care and if anything went beyond what he'd already paid, he'd settle the rest when he returned next month.

I shook my head in confusion. "Are you out of your mind!?" I asked.

He just laughed gently. "Sometimes when you're doing the right thing, you look a little insane."

Then he left.

His joy despite losing money. His peace despite helping an enemy. His quiet willingness to lower himself, to serve someone who wouldn't even speak to him on a normal day...

He gave, expecting nothing in return.

He served someone who never asked for help.

He paid for someone who may never say thank you or even worse despise him.

And somehow, he did it all with Grace!

It stayed with me.

That day changed something in me.

I renamed my hotel: from Fair Deal Inn to The Good Samaritan Inn!
